

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

I can't quite believe I am writing this for the May magazine! Where has this year gone? I don't know if it's my advancing age but time seems to be flying.

As you read this, I'm hoping that the work to repair the church tower and to treat the dry rot has begun. We have been very fortunate to receive funding from the National Lottery Heritage Fund to do this work; without it we would be unable to proceed. It's important that we acknowledge where the bulk of the money is coming from, so that people who play the Lottery know how their money is being spent, and that it's being spent on local projects.

The work may bring some disruption to the church building in the short term, but it will secure the fabric of the building for the future. St. Thomas is a beautiful church, with wonderful stained-glass windows and a great heritage which is very much worth preserving. I'm sure all of us who worship here regularly, appreciate its beauty and feel that its beauty adds to our understanding of the beauty and wonder of God. That is the purpose of the building, to bring us closer to God through worship and fellowship. By being together in this place we, I hope, feel that we are part of the Body of Christ in Moorside and Sholver, and across the world.

Seeing the light as it shines through the stained-glass and falls on the walls or the floor is one of the joys of being in the building. What do you love about St Thomas Church? What is your favourite place or sight or object? What about this place brings you closer to God and other Christians?

Of course, we can worship and praise God anywhere and always, but church buildings are places where we can come together before God, with all our strengths and weaknesses, with our hopes and disappointments, and with a sense that we are not alone. I hope the building of St Thomas is a place you value and have come to love.

I'll add a quick note that by now Revd Richard Dashwood will have joined us as Assistant Curate. I know you'll welcome him and Hannah and make him feel at home. Please pray for Richard and Hannah, and pray for the building works and the contractors who are working here. Pray that this lovely building will be here for many years to come and that God will draw people to worship and serve in this place.



News from the Tower

Unfortunately, there is no news from the tower. Our main aim is to ring the bells for our 10.30am Sunday service and we are able to do this most weeks but only ringing three or four of our eight bells. We are desperately short of ringers at present and ringing is at its lowest point for many years. I know there are many people living in the parish who have learnt to ring in the past and if they could find the time to help us on a Sunday morning that would be greatly appreciated.

In the past, in fact since the early 1900s, St Thomas' has been able to boast a proficient band of ringers. There are many peal boards on the walls in the ringing room with details of peals rung by local ringers. One of these records a long length (twice the length of a regular peal and lasting for six hours) rung in the 1920s. This is an exceptional feat even by today's standards and there are few, if any, local bands that could accomplish this. I personally feel so proud of the Moorside ringers of long ago for their achievement.

Please speak to Peter if you would like to have a taster session on a Monday evening or other time. It does take a bit of time and regular practice to handle a bell well, but once you can do this it can become a rewarding and enjoyable hobby.

Sierra Leone is the world's most dangerous place to become a mum. Every day 10 women die from giving birth. In Sawula district, the community struggle with a clinic which has no electricity and only two delivery beds.

Jebbeh is heavily pregnant but as her baby grows, it's not joy that fills her heart, but fear. When Jebbeh's

sister Fatmata went in to labour, there were so few ambulances that Fatmata had no choice but to walk for three hours under the baking sun, to the nearest hospital. The journey was long and with every step Fatmata struggled to keep walking. Jebbeh told us: 'My sister was crying out with hunger. She died on the side of the road. She never gave birth.'

This Christian Aid Week, together, we can make childbirth safe for mums and babies. Through our gifts and prayers, we can help give the world's poorest mums a chance to live.

Foster Care Fortnight 13th to 26th May

This fortnight is the Fostering network's annual big push to raise the profile of fostering, and to show how foster care can transform children's lives.

The need is huge: thousands of new foster families are needed every year to care for children in need.




