For those of you who have been unable to meet or be close to your families recently, you should know that God is with you as God is with all of us.



#### **Festivals and Commemorations for Autumn**

**Harvest Festival – Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> October –** The church will be open from 10am until 4pm on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> October and before and after the Sunday morning services until 3pm for donations. All Souls – Commemoration of Departed Loved Ones – Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> November at 6.30pm – This service will take place despite the restrictions at time of writing. Please contact Revd Denise by phone, email or in person if you wish to attend. Alternatively, please contact Revd Denise with names of those you wish to be remembered at this service if you are not able to join us.

**Remembrance Sunday – Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> November** – This will be different from previous years. The Parish Eucharist will be celebrated at 10am timed to finish at 10.45am. The Act of Remembrance, including the two minutes silence, will take place outside in the churchyard and involve the laying of wreaths on the Commonwealth War Graves. This will be timed for the silence at 11am. We hope this will enable more people to attend at a safe social distance.



We have welcomed some new children to Sunday school which has been wonderful and the usual faces have returned which has just been a joy!



#### <u>Reader Ministry</u>

The path I have travelled on my spiritual journey has been a long one with I guess not surprisingly, the inevitable twists and turns and pitfalls, but at every step of the way I have felt myself to be truly blessed and protected by God. Now I hope to commit myself more fully through further training which I hope will enable me to exercise my ministry in a broader way.

I have attended church since I was a teenager and have worshipped at St Thomas for thirty years. For most of this time I can honestly say that I felt no calling at all until about ten years ago when the Diocese began to promote lay ministry courses. I felt an inner voice calling me to respond and I prayed about it – but I did nothing. The voice remained persistent for a couple of years, and would not go away – in fact it became so loud that I could no longer ignore it and I took myself to a Saturday morning meeting about Authorised Lay Ministry. At the same meeting someone spoke about the Foundations for Ministry course and that sounded so exciting that I signed up for that as well.

I thoroughly enjoyed and felt spiritually enriched by both courses. I began to give a talk during our Sunday morning service every now and again and put together evening services to commemorate WW1, the Battle of The Somme and an Easter Celebration service. About a month after being commissioned as an ALM our incumbent Brenda retired and so I began to lead our monthly Parade services, beginning with the November Service of Remembrance.

I have constantly felt called to follow further training and progress in my ministry but have held back, wanting to devote more time to composing music. Finally, I have decided that if I manage my time wisely, maybe there is in fact time to do both. After applying for Reader training and having three interviews I have been accepted on the course and am looking forward to expanding my knowledge and experience in various different ways. Quite simply, I hope to continue to do what I already do in church – but do it better – with a deeper awareness and understanding of God's Word and teaching.

**PARISH SHARE** We have paid a further £2,000 towards our parish share making £8,000 against our £36,000 commitment. The spotlight is on us as to why we are not meeting our parish share. Yes, of course, this year is much more challenging but we paid less than 60% of our parish share for the past 2 years. The Wednesday night services are always well attended and have recently restarted. However, the financial giving at these services is negligible and not realistic. We don't want to be penalised and possibly lose our super vicar do we? Who Knows? Therefore, we (congregants and people in the parish) need to give more thoughtfully and realistically to maintain our beautiful church.

**Shops dreaming of an early Christmas this year** Christmas should start with October's half-term this year, rather than in November. Christmas lights could be switched on, and shoppers (hopefully) enticed back to the shops. So say many retailers, as they struggle to recover from the pandemic. An executive with the New West End Company in London explains: "If we can bring the start of Christmas early, it will make it easier for people to spread their spending."

Making 'Christmas come early' may have another advantage. Traders argue that having more weeks of Christmas shopping will ensure a more steady flow of visitors, which will make social distancing easier. Meanwhile, shopping remains in the doldrums. In some parts of the country, numbers of shoppers are still 63 per cent down on last year. Shopping in the West End has been at only 37 per cent of the normal level.



My Eco Tip this month has not come from my book about getting rid of plastic, it is a variety of ideas I have picked up over the last few years to try and do a plastic free Christmas.

#### Cards -

- 1. How you send your Christmas greetings can make a huge difference.
- 2. Send virtual card instead of actual cards or use the Church magazine to send good wishes.
- 3. Recycle part of last year's cards, use the images or pop out sections to design your own cards this year.
- 4. If you are less artistic then when selecting your cards then check they do not contain glitter and plastic which make them harder to recycle.
- 5. If you do buy cards then select an ethical company or charity card so your money is getting even more value.

#### Presents -

- 1. Try to make presents by knitting or crocheting a winter accessory or recycle items rather than buying new.
- 2. Give an experience day or a gift token.
- 3. Give a subscription to a charity, perhaps adopt an animal for someone, sponsor child or twin a toilet.
- 4. Again, purchase from an ethical source and help ensure fair trade.

#### Wrapping -

- 1. Avoid the shiny wrapping paper it's often mostly plastic. Many stores now sell some lovely paper-only wrapping paper.
- 2. Make a decorative bag that can be reused again and again.
- 3. Brown paper, candy cane string and a brown card gift tag (from the North Pole) make for amazingly effective wrapping.

#### Understanding the Bible




As we acknowledge Bible Sunday this month, it's a good opportunity to ask the question: *why should I read the Bible?* 

The Bible is the world's best-selling book of all time. However, it isn't one book, but a library of 66 books, composed by some 44 writers over a period of 1500 years in a range of literature including history, poetry, prophecy, letters and apocalyptic (end times). Despite having a number of different writers, the Bible claims one author: God himself!

This is the basis of the unity of its message and authoritative claim to be the primary way by which God speaks to us: 'All Scripture is Godbreathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work' (2 Timothy 3:16). The Bible is inspired ('the word of God in the words of men') and presents itself as a **manual for life**, equipping us to live for God in every aspect of our lives. We also have the promise of the Holy Spirit to guide us in applying the words to our lives: 'the Spirit will guide you into all truth' (John 16:13).

However, the Bible could also be described as a **love letter** from God, as He uses it to deepen our relationship with him. As Jesus said: 'You diligently study the Scriptures because you think that by them you possess eternal life. These are the Scriptures that testify about me' (John 5:39,40). Christians follow a person not a book, and the Scriptures are intended to help us to know Jesus better.

At her coronation the Queen was given a Bible with the words '**the most precious thing this world affords'.** Does this reflect our own attitude to the Bible?

#### The language of church-going

BULLETIN: Your receipt for attending the service.

HOLY WATER: A liquid whose chemical formula is H2OLY.

HYMN: A song of praise usually sung in a key three octaves higher than that of the congregation's range.

INCENSE: Holy Smoke!

JUSTICE: When your children have children of their own.

KYRIE ELEISON: The only Greek words that most Catholics and Anglicans can recognise besides gyros and baklava. (it means Lord have mercy)

PEW: A medieval torture device still found in many Anglican and Catholic churches.

PROCESSION: The ceremonial formation at the beginning of the service, consisting of altar servers, the celebrant, and late parishioners looking for seats.

RECESSIONAL: The ceremonial procession at the conclusion of the service – led by parishioners trying to beat the crowd to the carpark.

RELICS: People who have been going to church for so long that they actually know when to sit, kneel, and stand.

TEN COMMANDMENTS: The most important – and oldest – Top Ten list.

USHERS: The only people in the church who don't know the seating capacity of a pew.

This series is written by Dr Ruth M Bancewicz, who is Church Engagement Director at The Faraday Institute for Science and Religion in Cambridge. Ruth writes on the positive relationship between Science and Christian faith.



For the Christian, the Bible is God's word to us; it tells us about His character and creative purposes, how He has related to people in the past, and His promises for the future. Science is a specific way of studying the world, exploring the physical properties of things – a wonderful way to explore God's creation. So, the question to ask if the Bible and Science seem to be contradicting each other is, have we made a mistake in interpreting one or the other?

Science is very good at answering certain types of questions: 'What size is it?', 'How fast does it travel?', 'What is it made of?', and so on. Questions like 'What's it for?', 'What should I do with it?', and 'What's it worth?' can't be answered using scientific methods. Some of the misunderstanding in discussions of science and religion come from not recognising the limits of science.

It's also important to recognise what the Bible is, and what sorts of questions it can answer. The Bible was written well before people began to investigate the world in ways we would recognise as scientific. Of course, people in the Ancient Near East were studying the world around them, observing the movements of the stars, the processes of life and death that happened all around them, the seasons, the behaviour of physical objects, and so on. But they did not study the mechanisms underlying these things systematically using the tools of science, and they did not see or describe the world in scientific terms – not because they weren't intelligent, but because science as we know it wasn't happening at that time.

Instead, the biblical writers used words that were commonly used in their own cultures to record events, share truth and wisdom, and tell stories that convey deep truth about God's character. If we want to understand God's intention in inspiring these words, we need to do some careful work to connect with those ancient writers and find out what they meant, before we can discover what those words mean to us today.

These principles can help us have far more fruitful conversations about science and Christian faith. If we allow any apparent conflict between Science and the Bible to fuel our search for understanding, not only will we learn as individuals, but we will be able to draw others into a conversation that is relevant to wider society today.
